A native of southwest Virginia, Ron Thomason founded the Dry Branch Fire Squad in 1976. To date, the band has recorded over twenty-one projects and performed at the most prestigious acoustic music venues and festivals in North America. Currently working with Rounder Records, most bluegrass observers agree that Dry Branch's line-up is one of its strongest ever. In addition to Ron Thomason on mandolin, guitar and lead vocals, other group members are: Brian Aldridge on guitar, mandolin and harmony vocals; Tom Boyd

on banjo, dobro and harmony vocals; and Danny Russell on bass and harmony vocals.

Musically, their starting point is classic bluegrass, to which they add a wide-ranging repertoire of vintage and contemporary sources. These guys have been playing bluegrass stages for a long time. Thomason's droll "country bumpkin" (but not really) monologues are also a big part of the band's show. Audiences are not only filled with the emotions that stimulated the creation of bluegrass and mountain music but are also given a taste of the culture from which this music evolved.
