Our buy-in portion was offset by the Shell Lake Firefighting equipment as an equivalent monetary investment. An additional maintenance fee will be charged by the Regional Fire Department on an annual basis. This year the fee of \$25 per property has been funded through the village's 2007 operating budget.
